Citizenship/Immigration Status

The Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Act of 1996, HR 3437, and the Regulations of

Continuing Education

Every pharmacist registered to practice in New York State must complete 45 hours of approved continuing education courses for each triennial registration period. More than half of the required hours must be LIVE study credit. At least 3 credits (home study or live) of formal continuing education on strategies and techniques to reduce medication and prescription errors is required as part of the total CE credits needed for the registration period. If a registration period is for less than three (3) years, the requirement is 1.25 hours per month. A continuing education fee of \$45 per triennium is included in the registration fee. Each licensee shall maintain evidence of such coursework for a period of six (6) years and be subject to audit by the Department. If you are selected for audit, you will be required to submit documentation of course completion. Do not send any documents unless you presently have a conditional registration. If you hold a conditional registration, you must submit course completion certificates verifying that you have met the requirement. Adjustments to the requirement may be requested for reasons of health or other good cause which would prevent compliance. Conditional registrations are not automatic and may be issued at the Department's discretion. A conditional registration, if granted, is valid for one year and cannot be renewed or extended.

You may request a conditional registration for a one-year period if you agree to:

- pay the full triennial registration fee for the one year conditional registration;

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- complete the continuing education hours you are lacking from your previous registration period, and
 - complete the regular continuing education requirement prorated for the one-year conditional registration period.

Prior to the end of the one-year conditional registration, you will be sent a Registration Renewal Notice to renew your registration for the remaining two years of the registration period. You must pay the full triennial registration fee and submit proof of course completion before you will receive a registration for the remaining two years. Failure to meet the requirements of the conditional registration may subject you to prosecution for professional misconduct. Adjustments to the continuing education requirement may be granted by the department for reasons of health documented by an appropriate health care professional, extended active duty with the armed forces of the United States, or other good cause. A written explanation documenting the circumstances which prevented compliance with Education Law must be sent to the attention of State Board for your profession. If you do not request an alternative, your registration will not be renewed and you may not practice after your current registration expires. If you do not intend to practice in NYS, you may inactivate your registration by going back to the main page and selecting "Inactivate Registration".
